ICT Expo

At this years expo a Supreme Award worth \$500 will be awarded to the best school expo site. (As a Supreme Award it does not go towards overall aggregate prize).

- o Range of ICT/e-Learning
- oScience/Putaiiao

Here is some other information about the ICT EXPO set up.

- Please bring all the power leads, multi- plugs, monitors, screens, etc necessary for your ICT expo display.
- The venue is TKKM o Te Waiu o Ngati Porou Hall (you may set up the afternoon before but please contact Hinerau at Te Waiu before arriving)
- The expo runs from 9.30 am to 12.15pm. The powhiri will be at 8.45am
- Schools MUST have set up their sites prior to the powhiri on the morning of the expo.
- Schools are welcome to show their Nati Award entries at the Expo but please not any that are finalists

•Please register with Leeanne Morice at E Tipu E Rea. Once all registrations are received schools will be notified where they will be located on the floor plan.

## ICT Workshop

Each year at the Festival we hold an one hour ICT workshop, where digital media professionals are invited to talk to a group of students about their careers.

This years Guest Speaker will be television presenter Matai Smith, who will be talking about his career since starting as an 18 year old at Marae.

We are asking schools to choose 2 students per Primary school and 2 per secondary school to take part in this workshop
